

#### **Assistant Professor of Biology**


Dr. Griffin was the lead author on "Soil macronutrients and plant host identity explain little variation in sapling endophyte community composition: disturbance as an alternative explanation?" in the *Journal of Ecology* which was nominated for the Harper's Prize for best Early Career Researcher. He also published as lead author "Tree diversity reduces fungal endophyte richness and diversity in a large-scale forest experiment" in *Diversity*.

#### Jessica Snow Ph.D.

#### Research Faculty in Biology/Grants

Dr. Snow completed her American Heart Association Award focused on the role of G Protein Coupled Receptor (GPER) in the development of pulmonary hypertension, or high blood pressure in the lungs. Dr. Snow had one first author publication on the Reactive Oxygen Species in the lung entitled "Intermittent hypoxia augments pulmonary vasoconstrictor reactivity through PKC $\beta$ /mitochondrial oxidant signaling" in the American Journal of Respiratory Cell and Molecular Biology.

She is a faculty board member on the Hermits Peak Watershed Alliance.

#### Gloria Gadsden, Ph.D.

#### **Associate Professor of Criminal Justice**


Dr. Gadsden is the founder and editor of the Social Moments Journal, a free online interdisciplinary peer-reviewed journal for students. The journal provides an opportunity for graduate and undergraduate students, examining the social and cultural world through a social science lens, to publish in a slightly less cut-throat "publish or perish" environment. She also served on over 20 committees and subcommittees while serving as the chair for the Department of Sociology, Anthropology and Criminal Justice.

#### Rebecca Alvarez, Ph.D.

#### Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice/Sociology

Dr. Álvarez, is the first author of the article "Forging a diagonal instrument for the global left: The vessel" published in the Journal of World-Systems Research. In the article, Dr. Álvarez and her coauthor, Christopher Chase-Dunn, explore the organizational limitations of current and past global social movements and propose a new structural strategy for the global left which combines aspects of diagonal leadership and currently existing transnational social movements.

## Todd Christensen, MFA Professor of Art

Professor Christensen organized and hosted a small printmaking conference and Art exhibition here at NMHU called Print, Printed, Printing. There were demonstrations, presentations, participatory events, exhibits, open portfolio, and a lecture on 500 years of Printmaking given by Dr. Robert Bell in which conference participants were able to look at original art from Master artists like Rembrandt, Goya, Kathe Kollwitz, and many others.

## Orit Tamir, Ph.D. Professor of Anthropology

Dr. Tamir secured a donation of Southwest Native American pottery and basketry along with a considerable collection of historical Maya textiles - huipil - for educational purposes. She also served as guest co-editor of a special collection of articles in Teaching and Learning Anthropology and published two articles in the same journal: "Montraditional students: Understanding and meeting their needs in the anthropology classroom. Teaching and learning anthropology" and "Diverse student experiences in higher education: Implications for the anthropology classroom". Dr. Tamir also continues her work as the coeditor of the Society for Applied Anthropology News.

#### Norma A Valenzuela, Ph.D. Assistant Professor of Spanish

Dr. Valenzuela lead the Thomas C. Donnelly Library Reading and Discussion Group on "No history is illegal: A multicultural American history". She was selected to present her forthcoming publication "Mestiza consciousness a la Mexicana in Ultima and Agueda Martínez: Bridging and legitimizing querencia in the borderlands" at the XII International Conference on Chicano Literature and Latino Studies. The chapter explores querencia (love of/for place) through the intersectionality of race, gender, class, and nation as sites of contestation in the life of two major Nuevo Mexicana protagonists, Ultima, a fictional character, and Agueda Martínez, a Chimayo weaver.

#### Eric Romero, Ph.D.

#### Instructor of Native American & Hispano Studies

Dr. Romero published "Escuela nacional de antropologia e historia/national school of anthropology and history 1980-1986" in La Revista Bilingue/The Bilingual Review. In the same journal, he was guest editor of the special issue "The Becas para Aztlan program: The transnational experiences of Chicana/o graduate students". Dr. Romero performed significant service work including being the Chair of the Statewide Diversity Summit, Co-Chair of the University Wide Strategic Planning Committee, and Vice Chair of the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Council.

#### Sebastian Medina, Ph.D. Assistant Professor of Biology

Dr. Medina authored four research articles published from September 2020 to January 2021, and was lead author on two in Scientific Reports and Toxicology and Applied Pharmacology. Titles of his lead authorships include "Modulation of PARP activity by Monomethylarsonous (MMA+3) acid and uranium in mouse thymus" and "Exposures to Uranium and Arsenic Alter Intraepithelial and Innate Immune Cells in the Small Intestine of Male and Female Mice". He also presented a research poster at the National Institutes of Health/National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences Superfund Research Program Virtual Annual Meeting on December 13-15, 2020.

## Jesus A. Rivas, Ph.D. Professor of Biology


Dr. Rivas published a paper "Climate Change and speciation pulses in a nearly flooded continent: talking the riddle of South America's high diversity" proposing a new model to explain the high diversity in the continent. He also published a paper in collaboration with Brazilian colleagues on telemetry and movement of Yellow Anacondas (Eunectes notaeus). Last, he published a book on 28 years of research on green anaconda with Oxford University Press entitled Anaconda: The secret life of the world's largest snake. He continued to serve as Associate Editor of The Journal of Herpetology where he reviewed and organized the peer review process of numerous manuscript submissions. In addition, Dr. Rivas became a Certified Wildlife Biologist by The Wildlife Society; which will allow him to endorse our graduates to obtain certification themselves.

#### Eric Griffin, Ph.D.

#### **Assistant Professor of Biology**

In March of 2021, Dr. Griffin's four-year research proposal (\$913,227) entitled "Microbiome mediation of multi-trophic interactions in a tree diversity experiment" was funded by the National Science Foundation. Since the summer of 2020, Dr. Griffin has presented his research at invited seminars at UNM, NMSU, NMHU, as well as in local communities at the Las Vegas Middle School Science and Health Career Camp and Nature Niños New Mexico. Moreover, he and three undergraduate researchers presented a poster at the New Mexico Research Symposium on October 8-10, 2020. Most recently, Dr. Griffin served on a panel at the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute Terrestrial and Marine Microbial Symposium on March 24-25, 2021.

#### Blanca Céspedes, Ph.D.

Assistant Professor of Forestry and Interim Chair, Department of Forestry

Dr. Céspedes has collaborated with forestry faculty members at Northern Arizona University to co-author a chapter in a new fire ecology book titled Past, present, and future fire ecology and management across us forested ecosystems addressing the past, present, and future ecology and management of fire across US forests, providing a broad synthesis to aid sustainable management of forests under our changing climate. Dr. Céspedes' chapter is called "Southwest fire ecology and management of southwestern forests".

## Julie Tsatsaros, Ph.D. Instructor of Forestry

Dr. Tsatsaros' article "Improving water quality in the wet tropics, Australia: A conceptual framework and case study" was published in the journal Water, and was chosen as an editor's choice article. Additionally, Dr. Tsatsaros is the lead author of the manuscript "Supporting community led water quality monitoring in river basins adjacent to the great barrier reef, Australia" which has been accepted for publication in the Journal Marine Pollution Bulletin.

#### Kyle Shaney, Ph.D.

#### **Assistant Professor of Forestry**


Dr. Shaney published the article "Defining intraspecific conservation units in the endemic Cuban rock iguanas (Cyclura nubila nubila)" in Scientific Reports. This article discusses the importance and challenges of defining conservation management units for species of concern and uses the example of the Cuban rock iguana as a case study for how this process can be informed through a better understanding of a species' phylogeographic characteristics.

#### Jennifer Klutsch, Ph.D.

#### **Assistant Professor of Forestry**

Dr. Klutsch also presented a talk entitled "Identifying anatomical and chemical defense fingerprints in Alberta lodgepole pine against mountain pine beetle" at an International Union of Forest Research Organizations conference. She also co-authored two peer-reviewed journal articles: "Primary and secondary metabolite profiles of lodgepole pine trees change with elevation, but not with latitude" in the Journal of Chemical Ecology and "Selection of entomopathogenic fungus Beauveria bassiana (Deuteromycotina: Hyphomycetes) for the biocontrol of Dendroctonus ponderosae (Coleoptera: Curculionidae, Scolytinae) in Western Canada" in Applied Microbiology and Biotechnology.

#### Joshua L. Sloan, Ph.D.

Assistant Professor of Forestry in 2019-2020 and Director of Forestry in 2020-2021 During the past year, Dr. Sloan has served as the lead author of three articles, including "Nitrogen recovery from enhanced efficiency fertilizers and urea in intensively managed black walnut (Juglans nigra) plantations" in the journal Forests, "Drought-conditioning of quaking aspen (Populus tremuloides Michx.) seedlings during nursery production modifies seedling anatomy and physiology" in Frontiers in Plant Science, and "Southwestern white pine conservation efforts at the John T. Harrington forestry research center" in the New Mexico Tree Farm Bulletin. Additionally, he was awarded a LI-COR Environmental Education Fund award of \$33,083 to support the acquisition of instruments to measure photosynthesis in plants, as well as a \$225,000 McIntire-Stennis subaward from NMSU to support forestry research at NMHU.

### William Jaremko-Wright, MS Instructor of Geology


Summers 2019 and 2020 marked Geology Instructor William Jaremko-Wright's 4th and 5th years of annual bird surveys at the Rio Mora National Wildlife Refuge. He continues to monitor the effect of wildlife management and habitat restoration on migratory and breeding bird populations. Professor Jaremko-Wright is continuing that work in Summer 2021 along with collaborating with the Hermit's Peak Watershed Alliance on an Outdoor Recreation Equity grant. This work is focused on increasing access to outdoor recreation like fly fishing and birding. He will be leading birding walks with youths and families through the spring migration.

## Michael Petronis, Ph.D., Jennifer Lindline, Ph.D., and Joseph Zebrowski, MS (Collaboration)

#### Professors of Geology and Instructor of Forestry

Dr. Petronis, Dr. Lindline, and Joseph Zebrowski, along with NMHU alumna Rhonda Trujillo published a paper in New Mexico Geology, titled "Paleomagnetic data bearing on vertical axis rotation of the Rio del Oso dike swarm, western Espanola Basin, New Mexico".

#### Professors of Geology and Special Assistant to the President

Dr.'s Lindline, Petronis, and Martinez were awarded a \$275,000 grant from the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) to support its Water Resources Science program. The grant is aimed at increasing NMHU's water preparing underrepresented minority students for water resources science careers through the acquisition of new water analysis equipment, development of new hands-on coursework in water resources science, and applied experiences in the scientific aspects of water resources budgeting and water quality monitoring.

## Jennifer Lindline, Ph.D. and Tatiana Timofeeva, Ph.D. (Collaboration) Professor of Geology and Professor of Chemistry

Dr.'s Lindline and Timofeeva co-authored a paper with their graduate and post-doctoral students in the Journal Inorganic Chemistry Communications, titled "Magnetic behavior of 3d metal-organic frameworks constructed via 1, 2, 4, 5-Benzenetetracarboxylate linker and 4f Ce(III) or 3d Fe(III) metal nodes".


### Jennifer Lindline, Ph.D. Professor of Geology

#### **Associate Professor of Psychology**



Biobridge uses LED strips and cameras to create an interactive lighting display that is reminiscent of bioluminescent algae. Morgan wrote a short essay on his collaborative project with TrueKids 1 in "Acequia Aqui: Water, Community & Creativity, a catalog selected projects: 2018 — 2020" that was published by the Paseo Project in 2021.

### Kim Knox, LCSW Assistant Professor of Social Work

This mixed methods survey focused on school social workers in New Mexico which assessed their preparation for practice in schools in a state that has no school specific training or certification requirements. Results suggest that lack of school specific training in preservice programs left these participants identifying as feeling unprepared, however these school social workers found ways to facilitate their growth and professional development once they were in the field. The lack of early challenges and lack of preparation for social workers to be employed as school social workers has implications for social work educators as well as grounds for further research and potential policy changes.

#### Benjamin Bencomo, DSW, LISW/LCSW Assistant Professor of Social Work

Dr. Bencomo was named to the Governor's Racial Justice Council, by New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham, during the Summer of 2020.
